CONTENT SYNOPSIS

The course explores the fundamental skills of academic writing strategies using a step-by-step approach, clear relevant models, and varied practices to writing. Students will be facilitated through lecture, tutorial, and workshop to develop a well-organised, coherent, and logical essay using different styles of organisation. Through assignment and project, students will express themselves in academic register, utilizing the theories and conventions of writing which include paraphrasing, summarising, synthesising, and referencing. Upon completion of this course, students will be able to produce the compare-contrast and cause-effect academic essays.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this module are to introduce students to:

- 1. introduce students to the conventions of academic writing.
- 2. enhance students' use of written English in compare-contrast and cause-effect styles.
- 3. develop students' clarity of thought and research skills.
- 4. inculcate critical thinking skills.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

On completion of this module, the students should be able to:

- a. produce academic essay in compare-contrast and cause-effect style using proper citation and referencing.
- b. develop coherent essays by applying summarizing, paraphrasing and synthesising strategies.
- c. apply accurate English language register for academic writing purposes.

Students will do e-learning tasks on their own time to enhance their proficiency as well as to strengthen their writing skills.

Collaborative Synthesis

Students will work in groups of about 6 members and write a synthesis essay based on the three given articles. The length of the synthesis is about 1500 words.

Assignment 1 (Individual)

Compare-and-Contrast Essay.

Students are to write a compare-contrast essay on the selected topic by synthesising information from at least five self-sourced articles. The length of the essay is about 1000 words.

Assignment 2 (Individual)

Cause-and-Effect Essay Students are to write a cause-effect essay on the selected topic by synthesising information from at least five self-sourced articles. The length of the essay is about 1000 words.

End-of-Module Examination (OAS) Written Test

The examination question has one section. Students are to write a synthesis essay in either cause-effect or compare-contrast format based on three or four given articles. The length of the synthesis is about 600 words. The aim of this assessment is to enable students to plan and write essays in various academic formats and to use proper referencing skills to write a research article.
